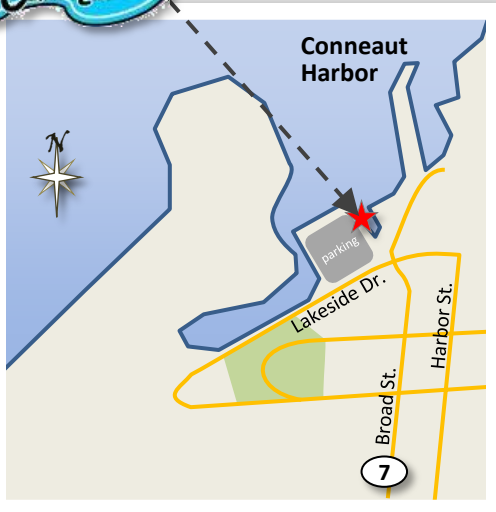




Conneaut, OH Charters

Diver's World works with Something Catchy Charters out of Conneaut Harbor, OH. This gives us access to many of the wrecks west of the Peninsula and in Eastern Ohio. Captain Brian Mills does a great job hosting divers and, if you are an angler, call him to book some great fishing charters on the lake.

Check our website and make reservations when the charters are scheduled. Due to the uncertain nature of the Lake, rain checks will be issued if a charter gets blown off due to weather.



Directions from Erie

Conneaut Harbor is approximately 35 mi. from DW.

1. Take I-90 west to Ohio
2. Take exit 241 (route 7) north to route 20.
3. Turn right onto 20 (east), go to next light (Broad Street) and turn left (north).
4. Take Broad Street north until it heads downhill into the harbor.
5. At the bottom of the hill, turn left into the public dock area. Look for the Shell gas dock.
6. *Something Catchy Two* is moored 50 yards east of the fuel dock.

Common Wrecks from Conneaut, OH

Susquehanna (depth of 55 feet)
 120' two-masted schooner

John B. Lyon (depth of 50 feet)
 255' steamer. The anchor was raised in the 1960's and now stands in Lakeshore Park in Conneaut as a tribute to the sailors lost in Lake Erie.

Carol Sue II (depth of 80 feet)
 63' wooden fishing trawler



Diving Checklist:

Diving below the thermocline will be very cold year-round (approx 45°F). Make provisions to dive in an appropriate environmental suit with warm gloves, boots and hood. In addition to your normal Scuba Equipment you will want to bring the following:

- Air or NITROX
- Boat bag (not your rolling travel bag!)
- Wreck reel
- Compass
- Save-a-dive kit
- Dive Knife

Other Items to Consider:

- Dramamine (if you get motion sick)
- Sun screen
- Water and snacks

Note:

Unless you have specifically called ahead of time to make special arrangements, you must bring your own gear to the site. Diver's World will not bring extra equipment.
